She produces work that looks at and experiments with ideas of how we structure and make sense of the world – questioning and illuminating the ways in which we read meanings into individual objects, influenced by our own histories and memories.

#### CULTURE VULTURES SCHOOLS SWOOP

A collaboration between schools across Liverpool with professional dancers and video artists. From January 2000 students from comprehensive schools, including Broad Green and St John Almond, will work across the city studying the variety of cultural influences in society. The students will work together to develop a performance which will tour each of the participating schools and conclude with a public finale at the Bluecoat.

#### IDENTIKIT

In September pupils from Alsop High School will work with visual artists Rick Walker and Alan Dunn to examine concepts of personal identity / public personae. Over 12 wks they will explore how identities are manufactured by entering into a heavily promoted political media campaign undermined by the unwanted intrusions of the tabloid press.
