A word from Bryan Biggs, Bluecoat Director

Double whammy for Bluecoat

As Liverpool prepares its bid to become European Capital of Culture, the Bluecoat is delighted to announce that the company heading the bid has granted an award to enable us to proceed with an architectural competition for our capital development. This means that our vision for a fully accessible, greatly enhanced and expanded centre for the arts, education and heritage at the heart of the city's cultural life, will be able to move a step nearer.

The second piece of good news is our success in attracting funding from the Esmée Fairbairn Foundation and the Regional Arts Lottery Programme (RALP) for an ambitious three-year participative arts project that will bring together communities across Liverpool to work with artists in creative collaboration. Building on the success of the recent Bluecoatconnect programme, the project will produce new performances and visual art which we will be promoting at the Bluecoat and elsewhere. The process starts over the next few months and activities will be regularly featured in future season brochures. In the meantime, we offer a full and varied programme over the summer, including music, dance, poetry, live art, theatre, workshops, architecture events and exhibitions of some of the most innovative new art being produced in Britain.

Andrew Mania, Penny McCarthy, Imran Qureshi 23 June - 21 July

Through the practice of drawing, all three artists share a concern with inventing new possibilities for the medium. They re-use or reinterpret their particular source material, whether it be the art of the past, traditional techniques or modes of representation, to explore and create new meanings and narratives.

Andrew Mania's work has an irreverent nostalgia for art history. He describes himself as a collector of curiosities or a cultural vagrant, sometimes recycling found images like old master drawings or photographs, then adding his own obsessions such as Yetis, UFOs or birdlike swarms. The pictures form clusters or concentrations on the wall or, more likely, off the wall. Within these arrangements and fragments a narrative unfolds.

Penny McCarthy uses the raw materials of scientific or art historical reference - technical manuals, cartography, anatomical drawings, mathematical formulae and meteorological data - to create new meanings that have little to do with function. A series of large scale black and white drawings on paper have been developed from a variety of sources including postcards, dictionaries, astronomical and medical imagery as well as personal texts. These collide and generate connections and narratives between apparently disparate starting points.

Imran Qureshi is one of Pakistan's most interesting young artists. He explores the possibilities of the traditional miniature technique and style to stage a witty and visually engaging social critique and personal narrative. He is the 2001 cair/Shisha Artist in Residence in Intercultural Drawing Practice at Liverpool School of Art and Design.

Beck's Futures 2

4 August - 15 September

Beck's Futures is an annual exhibition and prize devoted to identifying and supporting the most promising young contemporary artists based in the UK. The exhibition features works from ten artists short-listed for the £20,000 prize and the UK's largest art prize - a total prize fund of £65,000.

The Beck's Futures 2 judges are Gary Hume, Zadie Smith, Richard Flood, Katerina Gregos and Anthony Fawcett, chaired by Martin Van Nieuwenhuyzen, who says of the project, "The choice of the jury underlines the diversity of art in Britain today. The ten finalists all take a self-willed,

unsensationalist artistic stance and draw on a variety of visual traditions. Much to the jury's surprise there are five painters among the winners, which may reflect the relevance of painting for the younger generation."

The Beck's Futures Student Prize for Film and Video will be shown alongside the main awards.

This exhibition was first shown at the ICA, London and will tour to New York following its Liverpool showing.







