Performance Art is an ephemeral form – it happens and then it's over – so the history of performance exists predominantly through photography, film and video. Art, Lies and Videotape is the first Tate exhibition to investigate this art form and looks at key moments in the history of performance through objects, photographs, reconstructions, films and video.

The exhibition includes rarely seen work by major artists such as Vito Acconci, Diane Arbus, Joseph Beuys, Yves Klein, Yoko Ono, Francis Picabia, Man Ray, Robert Rauschenberg, Martin Scorsese and Oskar Schlemmer, as well as work from younger artists including Franko B, Ken Feingold and Catherine Opie.


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## LIVE ART BLUECOAT

AUTUMN 2003

Taking art out of conventional settings via a series of events in and beyond the building, Bluecoat continues its programme of live art this autumn with work that blurs the distinctions between visual, performing and other art forms and real life. Performance art's significance within the avant garde in twentieth century art is demonstrated in a timely, specially curated exhibition at Tate Liverpool, Art, Lies and Videotape: Exposing Performance that focuses on the performance document (see back page for details). Bluecoat's programme presents artists who are continuing this tradition of crossing boundaries and creating new contexts for their work.

The programme includes artists from the Bluecoat Associate Artists scheme, established to support regional artists to develop their practice. The three selected artists - Adrian Challis, Roger Hill and Rebecca Reid - provide audiences with opportunities to see work in development.

## ROGER HILL - THE MANDAYANA

Roger Hill's adventure has begun with live outings at Manchester's Green Room and Liverpool's Superstar Boudoir. He now invites you to enter the boudoir of transgender hero/heroine, Mandy Romero at The Mandayana. In this two-day installation at Bluecoat, littered with the e-mails and souvenirs of her round the world journey in drag, including a copy of the fabled book which visitors can read, Mandy will appear on the hour, to have the stories of The Mandayana read to her. These are no ordinary stories...and this is no ordinary woman!

# REBECCA REID - RHETORICAL QUESTIONS ON THE ART OF PUBLIC SPEAKING

Rebecca Reid continues to research and develop work around the art of public speaking and the status of the 'amateur' as opposed to the 'professional'. She presents a new performance in the most splendid of temples to learning, Liverpool Central Libraries. In a spectacular show of speculation, a pick and mix of public address, she questions the nature of oration and the voice of authority. Asking where is the space and when is the occasion for the grand gesture, she invites you to this public/private reading in a public reading room, an evening of private utterances, the artist's own unmediated personal appearance in a public space.

The year is 2012. Britain is isolated from America and Europe; its only allies are the middle- and far-east. Against this backdrop, two men meet in a public toilet, kill a copper and go on a rampage. As they fall ever deeper in love, they are oblivious to the slow but inexorable disintegration of a society they no longer recognise into religious fascism and intolerance. Alternative history, the politics of desire, literature, disease, gangsterism, sex, drugs and rock 'n' roll ejaculate across the page in an orgy of poetic transgression...

Adrian Challis, artist, writer and director of The Spark Collective, reads extracts from his first novel, XQ-28: The Story of a Gene. There will be a question and answer session at the end. XQ-28 contains sexually explicit material which some people may find offensive.

Bluecoat is pleased to welcome Pacitti Company to Liverpool. Having worked together for over ten years, they are celebrated for their unique visual and performance style.

Finale is performance full of sexual obsessions and jealous distractions played out against the hypnotic repetition of a minimalist soundtrack from Swiss cult electronica band Velma. The work dispenses with the narrative structure and character of Emile Zola's Therese Raquin and distills the book's main themes of deception, lust, spite and domination. The performance installation is accompanied by video and photographic work, further blurring the boundaries between performance space, activity, gallery and page. Described as "the most unusual and unsettling theatrical experience" (Lynn Gardner, The Guardian), Finale is as explicit and cruel as it is compelling and uncompromising.
