



# BLUECOAT DEVELOPMENT GETS GREEN LIGHT - BUILDING TO CLOSE FOR MAJOR REFURBISHMENT

With the recent announcement that two more major funders have agreed to support the Bluecoat development, the organisation is now poised to start work on its capital programme, the biggest change in the history of Liverpool's oldest city centre building.

The £9.75 million development features construction of a new wing housing magnificent gallery and performance spaces. It will also restore the historic façade of this Grade One listed building, enhance the popular garden, reorganise public areas and make much-needed access improvements. There will be dedicated spaces for education, artists' studios, creative businesses, our café and retailers.

The Northwest Development Agency and European Regional Development Fund have now confirmed funding which, together with grants already secured from Arts Council England and Heritage Lottery Fund, bring us close to our funding target. An appeal for the final amount will be launched in 2005 aimed at individuals, trusts, foundations and companies. Bluecoat's Design Team, led by Rotterdam practice BIQ Architecten, is now working on the final designs for the new Bluecoat. To keep you informed about development progress and our plans for the reopening, our website will be updated regularly.



# WATCH THIS SPACE

10 - 23 DECEMBER AND 6 - 29 JANUARY

This exhibition explores the use of urban public space and has been created through Bluecoat's participation programme Connect. Supported by Fivearts cities, it features collaborative work from recent projects involving communities working together with artists in the city.

For Making Space, Andrew Small worked with three groups to examine shared green spaces in Liverpool. Abbeyview Community Association in Childwall explore the use of Alpine gardens to recreate the sublime through sculpture and digital imagery. Young men from the 506 Youth Project in Fazakerley take possession of their environment through football and film in a non-threatening, elegiac and elevated way. In filmed interviews, Bluecoat garden users talk about the past, present and future of this popular green space, material that will inform the landscape architect's designs for the garden.

WILD! comprises two projects created by Bluecoat in collaboration with Liverpool Biennial. In Liverpool Experience, Andy Weston and a group from Halewood Resource Centre, created a large square mural and series of light boxes reflecting their experiences of Liverpool and the idea of being a visitor to the city. The Journey is a short film by Leo Fitzmaurice and groups from L8 Resource Centre and Fazakerley Croxteth Day Services, based on their own and others' journeys to Bluecoat and the Biennial, and the idea of contemporary art as an everyday experience.



## WAYFINDING

Julia Keenan has been appointed as lead artist on Wayfinding, a project that explores aspects of access to Bluecoat for disabled people. She will advise our Design Team during the development period and work with local people over the next year. ## CONNECT - OUT OF THE BLUE

Connect continues during Bluecoat's closure with a programme of projects and events involving artists and communities working together in creative collaboration. Much of this is associated with the development of the building and its heritage, including a project using the willow tree in the garden and researching Bluecoat's heritage to create an accessible and interactive public resource for when we reopen. We will continue our work with Liverpool Reads..., collaborate with Frakture on an acoustic ecology project, extend our work with Rice Lane City Farm, and develop links with communities in Halewood and Kensington.

# **BLUECOAT DEVELOPMENT PUBLIC CONSULTATION**

Public consultation is a key element of Bluecoat's capital development project. During the past 18 months we have engaged our users, including tenants, artists and the general public, in dialogue about plans for the building and how best to address their future needs.

A panel of people who use the Bluecoat garden continues to help us develop the brief for the landscape architect who will re-design this much-loved space. In addition, over 50 members of the public who use the garden were interviewed by artist **Andrew Small** (see **Watch This Space** exhibition, page 4), to obtain their views about future plans for the garden, information that will also help to inform the garden brief.

With Bluecoat currently having 17 different levels, physical access is a key issue being addressed in the development. An access group, comprising disabled users of Bluecoat, was set up to inform how the design team addresses the needs of all our customers. Together with the work that artist Julia Keenan is doing in the Wayfinding project (see page 6), this group is helping us shape a more accessible future for Bluecoat, not just physically, but in terms of how people can more fully participate in all our activities.


