

4x4 is the first in an occasional series of simultaneous exhibitions exploring the unique features of our gallery spaces.

Shana Moulton: Selections from Whispering Pines

Video work in which the artist plays an anxiety-ridden hypochondriac who seeks comfort in new age remedies and shamanistic rituals. Infused with humour and pathos.

Colin Darke & David Mabb: Commodity Form

The combination of two solo painting projects sets up a debate between the artists' social and political concerns. Colin Darke presents *The Capital Paintings*, 480 A4-sized paintings depicting familiar objects, from product packaging to ticket stubs. David Mabb's *Rhythm 69* comprises 70 paintings influenced by wallpaper designs by 19th century artist and writer William Morris and referencing the work of artist/filmmaker Hans Richter.

David Osbaldeston: Your Answer Is Mine

David Osbaldeston presents a large-scale print specifically for a billboard structure housed within the gallery space, created over six months of intense labour. Osbaldeston draws attention to the relationship between original and reproduced, the slowness of the hand-made and the speed of the machine-made.

Anya Gallaccio presents sculptures and a new installation for her exhibition at the Bluecoat. The highly regarded British artist experiments further with macramé as a form of drawing in space by working with rope and intricate patterns of knots.



In 2004 Michael Pinchbeck embarked on a journey in a graffiti covered Ford Fiesta from Nottingham to Liverpool. The car was packed with 365 mementoes that belonged to the artist's brother who died in an accident in Liverpool in 1998. To mark the completion of his journey, Pinchbeck ends the project at the Bluecoat.



An exhibition exploring and celebrating fresh approaches to drawing in contemporary art. The End of the Line features eleven internationally acclaimed artists, many of whom have not been seen widely in Britain before. As a group, their work represents a vast range of possible interpretations of drawing, from meticulously rendered scenes from everyday life to three-dimensional drawings invading architectural space.

The exhibition includes animation by Japanese artist NaoyukiTsuji, Michaël Borremans' enigmatic scenes of disrupted scale, Fernando Bryce's appropriated graphic imagery, invented fantasies by Chilean Sandra Vásquez de la Horra and Monika Grzymala's site specific invasion with wild delineations of tape.

To coincide with The End of the Line, Monika Grzymala has created Ruptures, a new site-specific installation for her solo exhibition at The Drawing Room, London. This installation will be reconfigured by the artist in the Bluecoat's Vide space.


