The End of the Line: Attitudes in Drawing

An exhibition exploring and celebrating fresh approaches to drawing in contemporary art. The End of the Line features eleven internationally acclaimed artists, many of whom have not been seen widely in Britain before. As a group, their work represents a vast range of possible interpretations of drawing, from meticulously rendered scenes from everyday life to three-dimensional drawings invading architectural space.

The exhibition includes animation by Naoyuki Tsuji, Michaël Borremans' enigmatic scenes of disrupted scale, Fernando Bryce's appropriated graphic imagery, invented fantasies by Sandra Vásquez de la Horra and Monika Grzymala's site specific invasion with wild delineations of tape.

To coincide with The End of the Line, Monika Grzymala has created Ruptures, a new site-specific installation for her solo exhibition at The Drawing Room, London. This installation will be reconfigured by the artist in the Vide space at the Bluecoat.
