Liverpool's centre for the contemporary arts



Welcome to 2017 and a special year for Bluecoat: our 300th birthday. The oldest building in both Liverpool city centre and the city's UNESCO World Heritage Site, we're also the UK's first arts centre. We're celebrating this with a year-round programme of exhibitions and events rediscovering the building's heritage, as well as presenting some of today's most exciting new art, dance, music and literature.

Bluecoat has a long and distinguished history of presenting contemporary art. Monet was shown here in 1908 and was followed in 1911 by a ground-breaking Post-Impressionist exhibition, featuring works by artists such as Picasso and Matisse. The building's future as a centre for the arts was secured in 1927 with its purchase by the Bluecoat Society of Arts, whose custodianship we continue to this day.

On 4 February we launch 300 days of celebration, during which we will tell the story of the building – its early 18th-century origins and connections to Liverpool's maritime mercantile culture, and its transition from charity school to arts centre. Follow us on social media to see daily facts we will be releasing about this colourful history.

At the same time, we open *Public View*, a special exhibition that brings together artworks by many artists we have supported over the past five decades. Bluecoat is thriving as Liverpool's centre for the contemporary arts because of the vision of its founding artists and supporters, and the imagination and inventiveness of artists from Britain and around the world who have contributed to it ever since.

Accompanying the gallery exhibitions will be a series of displays across the year, taking place as part of *My Bluecoat*, which will tell our 300 year history. With support from Heritage Lottery Fund, *My Bluecoat* is a collaboration with Liverpool Record Office and the Blue Coat School, which originally occupied the building before moving to its present home in Wavertree. There will be plenty of opportunities to join in this heritage project, and we want to hear your own Bluecoat stories.

In February we also introduce our Sociologist-in-Residence, Dr Paul Jones from the University of Liverpool, who will be with us throughout 2017. He will be looking at how Bluecoat engages with the city and the role of art in civic life, opening up debates about art, architecture and society for all to participate in.

Our Artistic Director Bryan Biggs, has drawn on his long involvement with and knowledge of Bluecoat to curate the programme for 2017. We hope it will highlight to people the impact of our work over time. Above all we would like to pay tribute to the support of the people of Liverpool which has enabled Bluecoat to be at the very heart of Liverpool's cultural life for many decades: we look forward to developing and enriching our engagement with the city through 2017 - and beyond.

Keith Piper: *Unearthing the Banker's Bones*

Renowned British artist Keith Piper's solo exhibition premieres a major new three-screen video installation, *Unearthing the Banker's Bones*. The work uses the perspective of a fictional future to address contemporary concerns about race and class. The artist draws on extracts of apocalyptic fiction by writers such as Octavia Butler and Mary Shelley, building his own narrative of social and economic collapse.

Piper's seminal interactive work *Robot Bodies* (1998) investigates the robot, android and cyborg as metaphorical carriers of contemporary anxieties around racial difference, and has been updated and re-programmed for the exhibition. The exhibition is completed by a new series of digital prints and paintings on unstretched canvas that refer to 19th century history painting, and imagine how this genre might be addressed today.

The exhibition, organised in partnership with Iniva (Institute of International Visual Arts), continues Bluecoat's long-term relationship with Piper, which began three decades ago with *Black Skin Bluecoat* (1985). The new work, *Unearthing the Banker's Bones*, is a 70th anniversary commission for the Arts Council Collection with Bluecoat and Iniva.

Post-Apocalyptic Landscapes, Post-Human Futures

Bluecoat and University of Liverpool's Science Fiction Hub present a programme of discussions and readings inspired by *Keith Piper: Unearthing the Banker's Bones.* The event explores the enduring appeal of post-apocalyptic landscapes in visual art, literature and cinema. Featuring University of Liverpool English PhD candidate **Beata Gubacsi** and University of Liverpool English lecturer **Dr Will Slocombe**.



Adham Faramawy: Janus Collapse (the juice box edition)

Discover the work of Adham Faramawy in an immersive video installation created for Bluecoat's first floor gallery. For this solo project, the artist continues his interest in identity and how it is constructed in the 21st century. Taking the language of advertising as a starting point - its promises and ultimate failure to deliver - he pushes its seductive brilliance to slime and slipperiness. Shot as live action, with layers of special effects, Faramawy's film work is presented as an installation in which screens rest on piles of sand, while images of rubbish - the afterlife of products - explode across the walls.

Auto Agents

Curated by the **AaA collective**, a group with learning disabilities, this exhibition of new commissioned works explores what it means to be independent by making your own decisions. It reflects the collective's personal experience of the limited choice and control many learning disabled people face. The exhibition features large scale interactive work by **James Harper**, paintings by **Alaena Turner** and a limited edition book by **Mark Simmonds**.

Workshop: Do Feel Think Curate

Reflecting on *Auto Agents*, this workshop explores collective and collaborative ways of working, taking the **AaA collective's** approach as a starting point. Shifting models of curating exhibitions as a collaborative process are explored, and **James Harper's** video lecture *Can't Touch This* (2016) will be screened.


Public View

From the Post-Impressionists in 1911, to showcases of the next generation of artists like the recent Bloomberg New Contemporaries, Bluecoat has developed a reputation as an important regional venue for new art. For over a century our gallery has helped launch many artists' careers, initiated and hosted significant UK and international touring exhibitions, and been at the forefront of new developments in the visual arts, while nurturing the local artists' community.

Public View brings together works by 100 artists who have previously exhibited at Bluecoat. The exhibition includes a wide range of work, including paintings, drawings, prints, sculptures and videos. Many of these have previously been exhibited in the gallery, some have been re-made especially for the show, and others are completely new.

Artists include: John Akomfrah, Jeremy Deller, Bill Drummond, Nina Edge, Leo Fitzmaurice, Lubaina Himid, Mark Leckey and Yoko Ono.

Also 4 Feb - 18 Mar, Bluecoat Display Centre presents Stalwarts, an exhibition of new collections by ceramic artists who have a long-standing relationship with the venue.
