HONORARY SECRETARY'S REPORT

This year Membership has increased from 321 Members to 336; 190 Associates 84 Professionals, 20 Juniors, 42 Country Members and 9 Honorary Members.

There were 34 new Members, 2 re-elections and 18 resignations.

The Club has suffered the loss of Dr. Olaf Stapledon, Miss L. G. Booth and Mrs. Redfern Halsall.

The various Groups have been more active than for some time. The Music Group held five recitals. The Painters and Sculptors' Group opened their Annual Exhibition in December with a Goose Feast. The Dramatic Group read "The Venetian" in April and the enthusiasm increased the activities of this Group. On Grand National Night there was a short play and dance, a play by Picasso and a cabaret preceded a dance in December and Members of the Playhouse Company were entertained on another occasion. There were several Saturday evening dances throughout the year.

The annual Children's Hogmanay Party could not be held as the Festival Committee were using the Life Room, but it is hoped that this event may be continued next year.

A Sub-Committee formed of representatives from all the Groups has considered the revision of the Rules. A general clarification has been achieved and no vital changes made. The General Meeting will be asked to approve these revised Rules.

The fabric to the Club Rooms is soon to be renovated by the Bluecoat Trustees as part of the war damage repairs to the building as a whole. It was thought that this would be a suitable time for the Club to replace and improve its own properties, such as kitchen equipment, crockery, furniture, etc. and for this purpose an Appeal Fund for £3,000 was launched. To date, £648 has been received from some 110 Members and ex-Members. It is hoped that all Members and friends of the Club who can, will forward their donations without further delay.
